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

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

Italian Alps, 1980. After what it looked like an endless journey, a young ethnomusicologist ends up right where she wanted to be: the little village of Crottarda. When she was little, she used to go there on holiday with her parents, and she never forgot the bewitching sounds that she heard at night during their stay.

Those sounds were the shouts that shepherds gave each other in between the crests; and now, moved by her academic interest, she wants to study this ancient, mysterious habit.

What she finds out is that the oppressive shadow of the mountain affects the village and the minds of its community, creating a hard hostility towards another village on the opposite, well-brighted slope, as if the conformation of the territory shaped its people's temper to the bone.

Helped by a local, uncanny girl and a speleologist only equipped with his own forehead lamp, the ethnomusicologist tries to decode the shepherds' sounds and the eccentric routines of the villagers, surrounded by a cryptic, dreamlike atmosphere – like an evocative and somehow disturbing fable.

But do these shouts really exist and are worthy of her study, or everything is just a trick of her memory? And are these strange people really what they appear to be, or the distance from the rest of the world made them unfitting to any kind of contact with “someone from the outside”?

To protect himself, Remigio applies his cleverness to creating a costume of his own, a huge and cumbersome suit of armour, but one night someone breaks in to smash and shatter it beyond repair.

In desperation, Remigio runs away that very night into the woods, in search of the only person who can help him: the notorious hermit Bonifacio, who has terrified the village for decades, creeping around in bizarre costumes made from natural materials.

Out on the freezing mountain Remigio passes out, and is pecked by crows, but wakes up inside Bonifacio's hut, with the old man tending his wounds.

Remigio begs Bonifacio to help him get revenge on the bullies by building a costume that will terrify them, but Bonifacio's strategy is to teach Remigio lessons about respecting nature: how to recognise and use natural materials, how to blend in and become 'invisible' in nature, and above all, that the best response to bullying is not to be afraid.

Born in 1971, Veronica Galletta worked as a mechanical engineer for many years. She is now focused exclusively on her writing.

In 2015 her unpublished novel *Le isole di Norman* has been **shortlisted for the Italo Calvino Literary Award**, the **most renowned and reliable Italian prize for aspiring writers**, which launched the careers of Marcello Fois and Paola Mastrocola, amongst others.

Finally published in April 2020 by **Italo Svevo** (an imprint of Gaffi Editore), less than two months later *Le isole di Norman* **won with unanimous vote the Premio Campiello Opera Prima**, the **most prestigious and important award in Italy for first novels and new authors**.

The jury of Premio Campiello stated that «**Veronica Galletta declares Ortigia' seaward geography a sanctuary of remembrance, brilliantly managing her topics of interest. The young protagonist, Elena, embarks on a restoration of her past with extreme inventiveness**».

Previous winners of Premio Campiello are Paolo Giordano with *The Solitude of Prime Numbers* (translated into thirty languages), Silvia Avallone with *Steel*, Valeria Parrella, Alessandro Piperno and Marco Missiroli, to name a few.

He has been honored with several lifetime achievement awards. Some of his novels and short-stories have been translated into English, Dutch, Spanish, French and German.

Prima che te lo dicano altri, published by Chiarelettere (an imprint of GeMS group), has been awarded with the 2019 Selezione Bancarella prize and Premio Augusto Monti, with film rights optioned. What we understand from the first pages of this novel is that Lorenzo and Dionigi are twin brothers whose lives have been tainted by an "original sin": after murdering his wife, their father was probably aiming at killing his sons too. But we also understand straight away that Lorenzo and Dionigi, now 18 years old, are missing.

From this point forward, we go back in time to discover what actually happened; back to a Saturday morning in Bologna when a quarrel broke out between the two brothers. Consuelo, a mutual friend, and Agnese, Dionigi's girlfriend, maybe played a part in that quarrel. Or maybe it was the fact that Dionigi beat up Raffaele, one of their classmates who is affected by mental illness. Or then again, maybe it had something to do with Andrea, the teacher who's helping Raffaele to deal with his problems, or with Pierpaolo, school' shrink and new boyfriend of Agnese's mother.

What could look like the typical plot of a young adult novel is actually a deep and sharp investigation on today's youth – and a dark, symbolic and possibly unsolvable relationship between two souls that, before they took their first breath, were actually just one.



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


